

Thinking about a greater Wellington Christian Education Network in 50 years time

1. New or restructured schools in the network will be informed by a carefully developed Christian education philosophy. Strategy, policy and practice will be grounded and driven by principles established in the [educational blueprint](#).
2. NZCPT will be the Proprietor of new or restructured schools.
3. There may need to be Land Trusts within the structure of the network.
4. The network schools will be State Integrated, non denominational, and co-educational.
5. State Integrated status will include 100% tagging teachers and a 90 to 95% preferential enrolment ratio.
6. Christian faith and theological rigor will underpin educational governance and practice.
7. The network will provide guaranteed pathways for Christian parents from year 1 to year 13.
8. The potential of including Middle School philosophy in educational delivery will be explored.
9. Flexible and appropriate governance and management structures will be explored including one Board of Trustees governing multiple campuses and a possibility of Executive Principal across multiple campuses.
10. The network will work with the Ministry of Education to plan and map interlocking enrolment zones and enrolment schemes to deliver pathways.
11. Early childhood education provision will be investigated as part of network provision.
12. A Memorandum of Understanding will be established with manawhenua (Te Āti Awa) to honour and include the people of the land and to truly reflect the bi-cultural nature of Aotearoa New Zealand.
13. The network will proactively partner with like-minded organisations including other Proprietors, the New Zealand Association of Christian Schools, the Association of Proprietors of Integrated Schools and the Association of Integrated Schools Aotearoa New Zealand.
14. The possibility of partnering with Christian Home-Schooling networks will be explored.
15. The network will identify and recruit equity partners to the vision.

16. Sights will be identified and obtained on a lease or own basis.
17. The network recognises the importance of its partnership with the Crown which means in good faith delivering in areas the Crown prioritises and which align with the Special Character of the schools, including the refreshed Ka Hikitia and Tau Mai Te Reo strategies, Action Plan for Pacific Education 2020-2030 and catering for students with extra needs.
